

SPRINGFIELD DISTRICT

SCHOOL BOND REFERENDUM RESOLUTION

WHEREAS it is the prerogative of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors to determine the amount of the School Bond Issue to be presented to the electorate in the 1972 Bond Referendum, and

WHEREAS the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has authorized a bond issue of \$54.9 million dollars in order to minimally meet the immediate building, building improvement, and expansion requirements for our rapidly increasing school population; and

WHEREAS the intense and rapid development of residential areas in Fairfax County has created the crucial problem of inadequate school facilities; and

WHEREAS the suggestions of makeshift solutions to the problem will impact schools which will in the near future be unable to accommodate an influx of children from remote neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS the mounting increase of construction costs will make a delay in school building programs costlier than if we are expeditious in solving our school housing problem and

WHEREAS there is no reason for the citizens of Fairfax County to assume that the rationale of adverse interest rates will not be even more intense in the future; and

WHEREAS the citizens of Fairfax County have historically supported adequate funding of school facilities;

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Springfield District Democratic Committee requests the members of the Fairfax County Democratic Committee to support the school bond issue in the amount of \$54.9 million.

This resolution passed unanimously.

HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the citizens of Fairfax County had neither advanced information of nor public hearings on all proposed highway construction in new and existing neighborhoods, and

WHEREAS much of the highway planning now underway is being conducted on the basis of an unofficial Highway Needs Study without the benefit of citizen input, and

WHEREAS rezoning applications are currently being heard in accordance with this Highway Construction plan;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Springfield District Democratic Committee through its Chairman show its opposition to this unauthorized procedure by appearing before the Board of Supervisors to request an immediate suspension of all hearings on rezonings affecting this highway construction plan until the following conditions are met:

(1) An official highway construction plan be adopted by the Board of Supervisors,

(2) That a complete and proper public hearing be held on all proposed highways to be constructed in Fairfax County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Springfield District Democratic Committee urge the voters in this election campaign to support this resolution and that the Chairman present this resolution to the Fairfax County Democratic Committee at their meeting on May 30, 1972 to gain the support of all Fairfax County Democrats, and that all appropriate public officials be notified of this action.
