

1990 STORM DRAINAGE BOND REFERENDUM
RESOLUTION

WHEREAS there is a need to reduce house, property, and road flooding and severe channel erosion as well as enhance water quality throughout the County; and

WHEREAS the County has identified storm drainage and flood control projects by utilizing the County's comprehensive storm drainage master plans, the regional water detention plan, drainage complaint files, and requests from County Supervisors and citizens;and

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors has authorized a storm drainage bond referendum in the amount of \$6.72 million to be presented to County voters during the general election on November 6, 1990;and

WHEREAS the 1990 Storm Drainage Bond Referendum provides for \$6.72 million for completion of 18 previously approved but unfunded projects throughout the County.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfax County Democratic Committee endorses the 1990 Storm Drainage Bond Referendum and urges the voters of Fairfax County to approve the referendum.

1990 SCHOOL BOND REFERENDUM
RESOLUTION

WHEREAS there is an immediate need to provide new school facilities in Fairfax County's newly developed areas which have experienced growth in membership;and

WHEREAS there is a need to protect the community's investment in school facilities, which have a present value of over \$2 billion, by the systematic renewal of the County's older schools that have reached a point in age when renewal is an absolute necessity; and

WHEREAS renewal allows the older schools to meet current educational standards by providing effective and efficient learning environments;and

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors has authorized a school bond referendum in the amount of \$169.26 million to be presented to County voters during the general election on November 6, 1990;and

WHEREAS the 1990 School Bond Referendum provides for (i) construction of two new elementary schools and the planning funds for a third; (ii) renewal of thirteen elementary, two intermediate and one high schools and the planning funds for the renewal of three elementary and one secondary schools; (iii) the air conditioning of ten elementary, two intermediate, and one high schools; (iv) construction of three special education clusters in existing schools; (v) conversion of three intermediate schools to middle schools in the Mason, Annandale, Falls Church areas of the County; (vi) funds for the site acquisition for an elementary school in the Pohick area; and (vii) other facilities improvements such as roof replacement and repair, boiler replacement, air conditioning replacement, underground storage tanks, and handicapped access.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfax County Democratic Committee endorses the 1990 School Bond Referendum and urges the voters of Fairfax County to approve the referendum.

1990 TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES BOND REFERENDUM
RESOLUTION

WHEREAS transportation is one of the most pressing problems facing residents of Fairfax County; and

WHEREAS the Fairfax County Federation of Citizens Associations has constantly urged the Board of Supervisors to improve and increase mass transit facilities for County residents;and

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors has authorized a transportation facilities bond referendum in the amount of \$80 million to be presented to County voters during the general election on November 6, 1990;and

WHEREAS the 1990 Transportation Facilities Bond Referendum provides for (i) local matching funds of up to \$36 million for a federal grant for park-and-ride and other transit facilities for the Dulles Corridor; (ii) up to \$25 million for the Franconia-Springfield Transportation Center including a six-story parking structure with approximately 1,800 spaces, 90 kiss-and-ride spaces and 12 bus bays; (iii) \$19 million for land acquisition and construction of a FAIRFAX CONNECTOR bus facility to support the expansion of CONNECTOR service in the central, western, and northern of the County and to provide feeder bus service to Metrorail stations in the Vienna Metrorail Orange Line corridor.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE Fairfax County Democratic Committee endorses the 1990 Transportation Facilities Bond Referendum and urges the voters of Fairfax County to approve the referendum.

1990 HOUSING BOND REFERENDUM
RESOLUTION

WHEREAS somewhere between 19,000 and 27,000 family units in Fairfax County are in need of affordable housing;and

WHEREAS the current supply of low and moderate income housing is continually decreasing;and

WHEREAS the lack of affordable housing is a significant factor in the County's ability to attract and retain a labor force for public services and for private employment;and

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors has authorized a housing bond referendum in the amount of \$21.75 million to be presented to County voters during the general election on November 6, 1990;and

WHEREAS the 1990 Housing Bond Referendum provides for (i) construction of 164 units of affordable housing for low and moderate income families, (ii) construction of a senior center in Herndon with 62 units of affordable housing for low and moderate income elderly persons, (iii) construction of up to 110 affordable efficiency units for low income working singles; and (iv) design, engineering and other pre-development costs for expansion and renovation of the Lewinsville Senior Center and Residences.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairfax County Democratic Committee endorses the 1990 Housing Bond Referendum and urges the voters of Fairfax County to approve the referendum.
