Amendment #1 is Flawed and Does Not End Partisan Gerrymandering

Amendment #1 creates a new system where eight legislators and eight legislator-approved citizens will control the redistricting process. It creates a new backroom for deals to be made among legislators to ensure their reelection. It also leaves the criteria for how the commission draws districts in the hands of the General Assembly. Legislators should <u>not</u> be part of nor in control of drawing districts.



- DOES <u>NOT</u> end the influence of legislators in the redistricting process.
- DOES <u>NOT</u> implement safeguards or guidelines for redrawing districts.
- DOES <u>NOT</u> protect voting strength of communities of color.
- WILL lock Virginia voters into unfair districts for another 10 years or longer.

The Democratic Party of Virginia, Fairfax County Democratic Committee, Virginia NAACP and SEIU Local 512 all urge you to vote NO on Constitutional Amendment #1.

THE ALTERNATIVE

The new Democratic majority has already passed legislation that sets fair and balanced standards and guidelines for redistricting state legislature and Congressional districts (HB 1255 / SB 717) for 2020. But this legislation will have no effect if Amendment #1 passes!

The Democratic Party of Virginia and a majority of Democratic legislators are advocating for an <u>independent commission</u> of citizens who have <u>no connections to elected officials</u> to draw the districts. There is legislation along these lines written for the next session which has an excellent chance of passing to actually end partisan gerrymandering in Virginia.
